


To date, over five hundred people in the diocese have completed the Episcopal Church's approved methodology *Seeing* the Face of God in Each Antiracism

Workshop. Participants have been enlightened and then inspired to proactively work toward eliminating the sin of racism. A subgroup of this commission recently completed a twelve part thematic based curriculum that ties persons in the Bible to African Americans. In May a forum featuring Bishop Sutton and Lt.
